ARENAS was recently featured in a news story on the Media Literacy
Ireland website in an article written by WP7 leader, Denise Callan of Momentum Educate and
Innovate. Media Literacy Ireland (MLI) is an informal alliance of individuals and organisations who work together, mainly on a voluntary basis, to promote media literacy in Ireland. Facilitated by Coimisiún na Meán, Ireland's media regulator, MLI has over 250 members, drawn from a broad range of sectors.

Its vision is for all Irish people to be empowered with the skills and confidence to be able to access and critically evaluate content and services across all platforms, understand and question how media and digital technology operate, identify and manage risks, and participate in the public sphere in a responsible, ethical and effective manner.

GENDER EQUALITY IN EUROPEAN EUROPEAN COUNTRIES – A REPORT

The Work Package 5 group in ARENAS recently published a comprehensive report based on their research to date.

This report aims to provide a concise overview of gender equality activities in the partner countries over the past decade, to understand the current situation.

The report shows that although many actions have been taken, are being taken and are planned for the coming years to reduce gender discrimination and promote gender equality in all European partner countries, it is clear that these two issues, which are strongly linked to cultural practices, beliefs and behaviours, remain problematic at many levels in many countries, despite all the actions taken at different institutional levels.

ANALYSING PRELIMINARY DATA TO

COUNTER EXTREMIST NARRATIVES



Members of the **ARENAS WP4 team** gathered in **Barcelona** to analyse preliminary data from recent surveys completed just before the European Parliamentary elections in 2024.

Upon deeper analysis, this data began to reveal patterns, pointing toward understanding who among European citizens may be most vulnerable to extremist narratives and, more importantly, why.



Each participant brought unique perspectives from their home countries—Latvia, France, Spain, and Cyprus. Their discussions revealed not only trends but also the nuances that make this challenge complex and interesting.

The team delved into the layers of psychological drivers, political beliefs, and trust in institutions that shape people's receptivity to extremist ideas. It's a challenge that transcends borders. You can read an overview of the preliminary data <a href="https://example.com/here/bell/memory-be




The Autonomous University of

held at the **Center de Cultura Contemporània de Barcelona (CCCB)**from September 25th – 27th.



The conference was extensively covered in the Spanish media and prompted significant activity on the ARENAS social media channels and website from across Europe.

The conference examined the historical roots of the main extremist narratives currently circulating in Europe. Then looked at how have they transformed over the last century and how they have been adapted to different historical and national contexts. Finally, it considered how these extremist narratives circulate and are disseminated in the present time in the political space and the media.



ARENAS PUBLISHES KEY REPORT

ON THE HISTORICAL ROOTS

OF EXTREMIST NARRATIVES

As part of their work on the ARENAS project, the <u>Work</u>
<u>Package 3 team</u>, led by Dr.
Steven Forti, has published a report on the Historical Roots of Extremist Narratives.



This report delves into the historical roots and evolution of extremist narratives in Europe, from the late 19th century to the present. It includes case studies from Germany, France, Italy, Spain, Finland, Poland, Hungary, Slovenia,

Croatia, and Serbia. This study is the first step in analysing the current circulation of extremist narratives in the political and media spheres and their impact on European society.

PROJECT ARENAS SUPPORTED



The SBRB project has been coordinated since 2021 by Giuseppe Zorzi, assisted by Daniela Ferrari.

ARENAS HOSTS ITS 3RD GENERAL

ASSEMBLY MEETING ONLINE

On 19 November, the ARENAS project held its half-yearly general meeting. After 18 months of work, the different project partners had a significant amount of information and content to share.

WP1 began by presenting its work in terms of management and administrative, organisational and financial planning for the project.



The presentation of the various scientific work packages, WP2, WP3, WP4, WP5 and WP6, was an opportunity for the WP leaders to present not only the work carried out over the last 6 months but also the activities to come over the next 6 months.

Of particular note were the promising advances in corpus linguistics and artificial intelligence (WP2), the roots and circulation of extremist narratives (WP3), the impact of extremist narratives in a polarised electoral context in Europe (WP4), institutional initiatives in the various European

countries in the consortium (WP5), and the ethical and scientific issues involved in conducting research on a sensitive subject (WP6).

In terms of communication and dissemination, WP7 outlined the large and growing audience that is learning about the work of ARENAS, the impact that communication activity on ARENAS has already achieved and plans to reach an even wider audience over the coming months.




